



Healthier Lyon County seeks to make our community a healthy place to live, work, learn and play by creating opportunities for healthy choices and building a culture that embraces healthy eating and active living. Together through *Pathways*, we're working with our county to make changes so that healthy choices are easy, familiar and an expected part of our routines and traditions.

Community Perception

The community-wide survey found:

- 73% of respondents indicate their support for the prohibition of all tobacco products in public indoor spaces, including private businesses that are open to the general public.
- 35% of survey respondents indicate that they feel that the community lacks sufficient options for healthy eating.
- 78% of respondents note that they feel the community has stayed the same or gotten healthier in the last five years.

Healthy Eating

Abundant Harvest received a \$20,000 grant to purchase a truck to support their food reclamation efforts. The Coalition helped evaluate policies, nutrition standards, and conduct a food waste assessment to improve reclamation. Focus includes increasing recovery of healthy foods. Executive Director Lee Alderman credits Blue Cross & Blue Shield of Kansas and Healthier Lyon County for enabling swift food reclamation and distribution to Lyon County residents in need.

Active Living



The **City of Emporia** received a **KDOT Transportation Alternatives** grant, which were supplemented with

matching funds from the Pathways Initiative,

to improve pedestrian infrastructure and public transportation stops at **12th and Burlingame Road**. This project will provide safe opportunities for physical activity and connect

residents on the



east side of town to key community resources.

Commercial Tobacco Control

The **City of Admire** is implementing a commercial tobacco-free policy at **Admire City Park**, home to a new multi-use court featuring pickleball, basketball, and tennis. The court is funded by a *Pathways* grant. The policy prevents exposure to secondhand smoke for park visitors.

Initiative Wide: Level of support for commercial tobacco control policies in outdoor spaces



Key findings:

Three-in-five respondents across the 24 *Pathways* communities support commercial tobacco control policies in outdoor spaces.

Results are based on data from an initative-wide survey of Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas members for whom e-mail addresses were available in each of the 26 counties in which BCBSKS has funded coalitions as part of the Pathways to a Healthy Kansas Initiative. N = 3,708. The survey response rate was 5.3 percent. For this question, 6.2 percent of respondents did not provide an answer (blank response).

Pathways to a Healthy Kansas combines evidence-based solutions and promising practices for improving healthy eating, active living and tobacco prevention to make a large impact in communities. The program provides community coalitions with the tools and resources needed to remove barriers and engage their communities – and represents the largest community grant program ever funded by Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas.

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
