Community Perception

- Country Lane Apartment residents participated in 3 focus groups. All participants noted a need for new sidewalks for exercise and connection to shared spaces like laundry facilities and manager's office.
- All focus group participants agreed they would utilize an outdoor gathering space or picnic area with shade at Country Lane Apartments if it was available.
- Across all focus groups, respondents suggested improvements to shared community spaces such as a television and game tables and said this would encourage more people to gather and socialize.

New makin Lake

New policies were adopted in the community making **The Nest** and the trails at the **Plainville Lake** tobacco free environments. **Plainville Wellness Coalition, Rooks County Health**

Department and partners also plan to update our **Community Health Needs Assessment for Rooks County** to evaluate health needs and begin implementing strategies.

Initiative Wide: Community conditions (e.g. housing, transportation, education) impact overall health.



Key findings:

Seven-in-10 respondents across the 24 *Pathways* communities agree or strongly agree that community conditions such as housing, transportation and education impact overall health.

Results are based on data from an initative-wide survey of Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas members for whom e-mail addresses were available in each of the 26 counties in which BCBSKS has funded coalitions as part of the Pathways to a Healthy Kansas Initiative. N = 3,708. The survey response rate was 5.3 percent. For this question, 6.6 percent of respondents did not provide an answer (blank response).

Pathways to a Healthy Kansas combines evidence-based solutions and promising practices for improving healthy eating, active living and tobacco prevention to make a large impact in communities.
